Championship

A season of mixed fortunes, the lads stared well in the first game and were unlucky to go down 4>3 to Waitamata away. Then with injuries to key players and a shortage of a quality and dare I say it some older and more seasoned players we struggled against some teams, and as happens when you are losing games even the close ones don't go your way. Top this off with a misunderstanding (from the players) about who was doing the coaching and who was a manager it made the job a bit more disjointed that would have been ideal. To the teams credit the majority of the players still gave 100% of what was asked of them. I believe if we can attract some more experienced players for 2012 season along with the core we have it will be much better year for West Auckland

Reserves

The season started slowly for the first few games until the squad became familiar with each other's attributes and skill levels. As the season progressed the losses turned to draws which then turned into wins, ending with a finale in the Reserve Cup Semi against Waitemata who unfortunately had the edge on penalties.

The final league placing for the season was 3rd, which indicated the teams mid to end of season commitment.

4th Division

Successful debut season representing West Auckland.

Highlights of the season included winning the men's plate final against East Coast Bays, the winners of Division 3, beating the winners of our league, another east cost bays team, with 9 players, and beating Ranui Swanson away in our final game of the league season.

Inconsistency resulted in us finishing in 5th in the league, albeit with the best goal difference in the comp.

6th Division Wookies

A New team this year, the Wookies were made up of some brand new players, and some players coming out of retirement or transferring from other codes. Run by Greg and Philip McLarin, we had an enjoyable season, which started out strongly, but deteriorated into a disappointing finish as work commitments and the weather impacted on the season. A slightly re-vamped team should be there for next year to maintain an extra place for social players at the club.

6th Division

This team had a mixed season where they won their grading group for 6th/7th grade and finished 4th in the 6th championship.

Over 35's

The 2011 season promised so much but in the end we came up short. Our aim at the beginning of the season was to come 1st or 2nd in our league. The final position of 5th was extremely disappointing to say the least.

We had to play in a 7 game grading round to determine which division we played in. We won 2, drew 1 and lost 4 putting us firmly in division 2.

Then two full rounds of division 2 competition which due to cancellations didn't finish until our last night game on the 27th of September. We started poorly losing our 1st 4 games and then after some very serious talk went on a mini resurgence winning or drawing our next 8 games (Won 6 & Drew 2). The bubble finally burst in the Masters Cup Semi Final when Oratia Vintage beat us, the eventual winners of the 1st Division.

SENIOR WOMEN

Championship

This was an extremely difficult year for the Women's first team with a disjointed preseason, the loss of some key players for the first time since 2004 and a small league where all but the strongest clubs had withdrawn. This made the reserve league particularly tough and I ended up compromising the initial selections to keep as much strength in the three teams as I could.

Further we have been able to give all the players a decent amount of game time every week since we began playing women's football in 2001but this year we really needed to leave the team on the field intact when it was going well.

We were still very competitive and drew 5 of our 15 games and had 5 one goal losses so we deserved to be in the league but I feel it is time to take a more professional approach with our top team. This includes a coach solely interested in the side, playing the strongest team possible and having at least one extra training that is just for the top 16-18 players.

I believe the majority of players would be happy to do this and feel that I would be better working with 1 or 2 other coaches on the reserve and social teams.

We are not sure of the structure of the leagues for next year yet but I would like to see our women's first team continuing to play in a top league as there are many talented players and we have great depth.

A mention must also be made of Amanda who did a superb job managing the side and did a large amount of contacting for both the top teams.

Reserves

Made up of the remnants of the players from the general ladies pre-season training, this team had one of the most diverse playing abilities and ages in the club, with players from 13 to 35, with some brand new players who struggled to kick a ball, and some who just missed out on a place in the reserve side. Unfortunately their coach had to move out of Auckland 4 weeks into the season, but the team was picked up by Philip McLarin. As the season progressed they really came together as a team and developed very well as players, finally scoring their first goal and point at the end of the first round. Many 1-goal losses (as opposed to 5 or 6 goal losses), 2 draws and 2 wins in the second round cemented their place as the most improved senior team. The side will be there for next year in force and will remain a great place for new social players at the club to play.

West Auckland AFC Bar Report 2011

This year has been a productive year for the bar at the club for a few reasons:

- The increase in prices of bar stock has netted an increase in income from the previous season
- We set up separate floats for the Thursday night, Saturday night and Sunday afternoon trading to try to monitor income on separate occasions and make it easy for volunteers on the roster to run the bar.
- We are controlling the flow of stock into and out of the bar in a more effective way. We are tracking the giveaways and prizes and are working up a system that tags them to the appropriate budget
- We have utilised space at the club and have more space for stock storage and have minimised the amount of purchases made from the Waitakere Licensing Trust by doing monthly large purchases. Saving time and effort and having more stock on hand for restocking upstairs regularly.
- We have been more available to club members for functions that generate extra income for the club.
- The new facilities such as the floor and fridges has made cleaning the bar and holding stock more effective. Having the use of the under-bar fridge has meant we can cope with higher turnover as we have cold product to replace in the display fridge.
- We now have 3 club members with bar manager's licenses Steve and Josh Roberts as well as me. This means we are more compliant with the Sale of Liquor Act and we have more options for roistering and maintaining an appropriate level of host responsibility.
- We have updated and brought our options for beverages in to line with modern pub culture and the market with options such as Cider now available.
- We have increased security of the upstairs lounge area as a necessity as we had several break-ins throughout the year. We were fortunate to only have damaged doors and some stolen stock. No money was taken.
- We have set up procedures for cleaning and general bar practice that are transparent for all who are roistered to bar duty.

Some things are still in development and are targeted as areas of improvement these include:

- Improved monitoring of cash flow and trading opportunities with a cash book
- Setting up a banking procedure and deposit system that works better than the current system
- Setting up/improving the system for tracking giveaways and prizes and allocating that cost/loss to the appropriate budget
- General cleanliness/maintenance of bar area
- Annual servicing of the dishwasher needs to be carried out, this is possible as we now have an account with Starline for maintenance and servicing of our equipment
- We still need to improve the glassware in the bar

• A new till system supported by modern technology, suited to out type of trading and level of transactions is also on the wish list.

Overall the 2011 season has been a successful season for the bar at the club we had steady patronage throughout the year, despite cancellations and I feel confident that the 2012 season will be just as positive with further improvement to the systems and procedures related to the running and maintenance of the bar.
